We anticipate that accepted applicants will be given about 10-15 minutes to present their work to the assembled group, followed by 5-10 minutes for questions from the audience. The exact timing and review process will depend on the number of abstracts received. Proposals will be made available online prior to the meeting. Submitting a proposal implies that the author grants BENAIS Student Chapter the right to publish it online, but retains all other copyrights.
